We are seeking to recruit individuals who meet the following criteria:

 practicing general practitioners (GPs) within Australia who see children (0-15yrs) as part of their regular daily practice

4. What does the participation in this study involve?

As part of this study, you will be asked to participate in the following:

Interview: A telephone (or video with only audio recorded) interview, and you will be asked questions about your experiences with children presenting with possible sleep disorders. The interview will take place at a time which is suitable to you.

With your permission the research team would like to audio record the interview. If you do not wish to be recorded but you would like to participate, please advise the research team and written notes will be taken.

5. How much time will the study take?

Brief questionnaire: Completion of online expression of interest and consent form will take approximately -3 minutes.

Interview: The interview will take approximately 30 minutes.

6. Will I incur any costs by participating in the study?

There are no costs associated with participating in this research project. By participating in this study, you will be reimbursed one (1) \$100 gift voucher.

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7. Will the study involve any risk or discomfort?

There are no foreseeable risks associated with participation in this research. Should you feel uncomfortable answering any of the questions included in the interview, or for any other reasons, you are free to withdraw at any time. Your involvement in the research will contribute to a greater understanding of childhood sleep disorders in primary care.

8. What will happen to the information collected about me?

By signing the consent form, you consent to the research team collecting and using information about you for the research study. Interviews will be audio recorded and transcribed. All the data collected in this study will be treated with complete confidentiality and no identifiable information made accessible to any person outside of the researchers working on this project. This information will be fully anonymised and combined with the views and experiences of other participants who agree to take part. No individual will be identifiable at any stage in the publication or presentation of the findings.

9. What if I want to withdraw from the research study?

You may stop the interview at any time if you do not wish to continue. The data and audio recording will be erased and will not be included in the study.
